TO CLOVERDALE CITRUS FAIR QUEEN SCHOLARSHIP CONTESTANT:

In consideration of your candidacy to represent the Citrus Fair, the following courtesies will be extended to you:

1. The Auditorium stage will be available for practicing the talent segment, by arrangement with the Citrus Fair Office, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon and 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.
2. All participants will be the guests of the Citrus Fair at a post Fair dinner.
3. The participants and their escorts will check into the Fair Office for admission into the Fair.
4. Participants may need to have an escort for the Program February 17th.
5. Proof of age by birth certificate must be provided.
6. Proof of grade point average must be provided.
7. A wallet size school photo must be included.

Deadline for returning signed entry form to Citrus Fair office, 1 Citrus Fair Drive, is 5:00p.m. Friday, November 18, 2011. Late applications may not be accepted unless previously approved by the committee.

2012 RULES
CLOVERDALE CITRUS FAIR QUEEN
SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

1. The 2012 Cloverdale Citrus Fair Queen Scholarship Program will be presented on Friday, February 17, in the Citrus Fair Auditorium.
2. To be eligible for competition, an applicant:
 - A. must be a resident of Cloverdale Township, which includes Geyserville, for at least one year prior to February, 2012.
 - B. must be between 16 and 19 years of age, currently enrolled in school, and must remain in school during the following year. If attending college, must carry a minimum of twelve (12) units.
 - C. must carry at least a 3.0 grade average with all required subjects to graduate.
 - D. must be single, not pregnant, and never married.
 - E. contestant must display a three minute presentation of talent which may include a performance in music, dancing, dramatics, or other lively arts, or she may elect to present a demonstration of a skill at which she is accomplished, such as fashion, creative writing, etc. Due to a lack of space on the stage, props must be kept to a minimum. Contestant must perform talent by herself. Consideration will be given by judges to amount of time devoted to preparing the presentation.
 - F. contestant will display writing and verbal abilities by composing an essay of 500 words or less (topic of choice of a current event nature) and present it for the Judges, the Master of Ceremony and the audience.
3. The criteria for judging the Cloverdale Citrus Fair Queen Scholarship Program will include Personal Appearance, Question on Stage, Judge's Interview, and Creative and Performing Arts.
4. Contestant must appear in semi-formal attire for contest. However, suitable costume may be worn for talent presentation and must be approved by the Queen Scholarship Committee. Escorts must be dressed in dress slacks, dress shirt with tie, sport coat or nice sweater. No athletic shoes.
5. If contestant is chosen, she must agree to attend parades and other public functions as required by the Citrus Fair Staff.
6. A contestant or runner-up who was chosen in the preceding year is eligible to compete only once.

If more than six applicants compete for the scholarship, an elimination program may be held. Final decision will be at the discretion of the Queen Scholarship Committee.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ABOVE RULES WILL DISQUALIFY CANDIDATE FROM COMPETITION

QUEEN SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

(Each participant will be given \$100.00 to help defray expenses.)

WINNER will receive \$1,200.00 scholarship, paid out in two installments, upon verification of school enrollment.

1ST RUNNER-UP will receive \$750.00, paid out in two installments, upon verification of school enrollment.

MISS CONGENIALITY will receive \$100.00, in addition to any other scholarship money.

REMAINING FINALISTS: will each receive \$250.00 upon verification of school enrollment.
